

Considering coordinating a memorial service coordinated through your church? We've prepared a comprehensive list of everything that you will be responsible for:

- ☐ 1. Identify the location and time of the service, reserve these as needed.
- ☐ 2. Select clergy, celebrant, or person of your choosing to officiate the service.
- ☐ 3. Determine the elements of the service (music, sermon, prayer, scripture, readings, eulogy, sharing from friends and/or family, video, etc).
- ☐ 4. Determine the order and timing of the service.
- ☐ 5. Select specific music and instruments to be used and who will perform the selections.
- ☐ 6. Prepare any video or audio that will be used in the service.
- ☐ 7. Transfer any floral arrangements delivered to the funeral home over to the church or place of service.
- ☐ 8. Transfer urn from funeral home over to the church or place of service.
- ☐ 9. Display floral arrangements.
 - ☐ a. Make sure that you have met with church or facility representative to determine where and where not floral arrangements may be placed.
 - ☐ b. Ensure floral arrangement set-up is completed at least one hour prior to the scheduled service time.
- ☐ 10. Designate someone to ensure timely and accurate removal of floral arrangements and delivery of these floral arrangements to cemetery, your home or designated donation site.
- ☐ 11. If there is a reception following, designate someone to move floral arrangements and any other displayed personal items to the reception area.
- ☐ 12. Provide a guest registry book.
- ☐ 13. Create an "Order of Service" to be printed in the program.
- ☐ 14. Have programs designed and printed.
- ☐ 15. Place the guest registry book at strategic entry points in the facility.
 - ☐ a. If there are multiple entries, make sure a table and registry pages are located at each entry.
- ☐ 16. Be set up and ready at the church to greet visitors an hour before the start time.
- ☐ 17. Meet with clergy/officiant and musicians prior to service to ensure that all participants understand the order of service and their contributions to the service.
- ☐ 18. Designate who will hand out programs.
- ☐ 19. Designate who will make sure all guests sign in.
- ☐ 20. Designate who will help find seating for guests and help those who are handicapped.
- ☐ 21. Provide the A/V person a copy of the video tribute.
- ☐ 22. Provide the A/V person a song list prior to service (if it's not live music).
- ☐ 23. If there are honorary pallbearers, pin the boutonniere on each one.
- ☐ 24. Provide the minister/officiant a clergy record.
- ☐ 25. Reserve adequate seating for all family members, special guests and groups.
- ☐ 26. Reserve a private meeting room or area for the family to gather prior to service time.
- ☐ 27. Determine if there will be a formal entrance and seating of the family prior to service starting.
- ☐ 28. Determine who will escort the family to their seats.
- ☐ 29. Determine order of seating and line up family members.
- ☐ 30. Discuss with clergy/officiant how the service will conclude. Will the family be escorted out to form a "receiving line" to greet guest?
- ☐ 31. Designate who will dismiss attendees from the service.
- ☐ 32. Designate who will lead the family out for the recessional.
- ☐ 33. Bring easels for large framed photo displays.
- ☐ 34. Bring tables with table cloths for personal item displays.
- ☐ 35. If there is a reception, designate someone to pick up and deliver the food.
- ☐ 36. If there are military honors, designate someone to be the point of contact for the organization providing the honors.
- ☐ 37. Ensure military honors are thoroughly coordinated.
- ☐ 38. Distribute honorariums to service participants including clergy, musicians, A/V staff, etc.
- ☐ 39. Designate someone to gather up all personal and displayed items after the service/reception.
